

1024 FIREFIGHTER LEVEL I CERTIFICATION

Objective

To evaluate the applicant's knowledge and performance. To determine if the applicant meets the criteria to be certified as a "Level One Firefighter" (in accordance with NFPA 1001 – 2002 edition)

Prerequisite

- Must be an active member of a recognized Fire Department.
- Must have completed Basic Firefighting Course from the Nova Scotia Firefighters School or completed in house training with Fire Control from the Nova Scotia Firefighters School.
- Must provide proof of current Standard First Aid Certificate.
- Must provide proof of current BCLS-C-CPR Certificate.
- Must have successfully completed Course 1022 Introduction to Hazmat or acceptable equivalent.

Target Group

Intended for firefighters who want to be certified with Firefighter Level I Qualifications

Methodology

Format combines a written examination and evaluation of practical performance.

Content

Test incorporates all skills and knowledge described by the *NFPA 1001- 2002* edition and *IFSTA Essentials of Firefighting 5th Edition for Level I Firefighter*, as adopted by the Nova Scotia Firefighters School.

Certification

Certification for this course is through the Nova Scotia Professional Qualifications Board and all applications must be submitted to the Nova Scotia Firefighters School a month in advance of the course for the tests to be processed.

Enrollment

Minimum 10 Students
Maximum 24 Students

Duration

Two days

Location

Nova Scotia Firefighters School only

Note

This test involves mild to heavy physical exertion. Proper protective clothing (PPE & SCBA) and work clothing must be worn. Limited supply of turnout gear available at the School. Course Manual *IFSTA Essentials of Fire fighting 5th Ed.* is recommended.
