

4001 TECHNIQUES OF INSTRUCTION LEVEL I

Objective

To provide the necessary theoretical skills to enable the successful candidate to deliver instruction from a prepared lesson plan as per NFPA 1041 2002 Ed.

Prerequisite

Firefighter Level I

Target Group

This course is intended for persons involved or interested in teaching theory and practical emergency skills to others. It would be of special interest to training officers, and persons that are trying to become Fire Officers.

Methodology

Classroom instruction, hands on training, and student presentations.

Content

As per requirement of *NFPA 1041 (2002 Edition)* Standard for Instructor Professional Qualifications, general knowledge and skills include:

- Preparation for Instruction
- Audiovisual Technology
- Demonstrations
- Student Progress Evaluation and Testing
- Instructional Delivery
- Structured Exercises
- Practical Training Evolutions

Certification

Certification for this course is through the Nova Scotia Professional Qualifications Board and all applications must be submitted to the Nova Scotia Firefighters School a month in advance of the course for the tests to be processed.

Minimum 8 students
Maximum 12 students

Duration

Six Days (3 weekends)

Location

Nova Scotia Firefighters School or other suitable location.
