

4002 TECHNIQUES OF INSTRUCTION LEVEL II

Objective

Prerequisites

Applicant must have completed a level I course of Instruction or equivalent and must have two years of experience as an instructor.

Content

- Legal and Ethical Considerations
- Report Writing and Record Keeping
- Student Attributes and Behaviors
- Instruction Safety and the Training Function
- Effective Interpersonal Communication
- Principles of Learning

Instructor II requirements include:

- Lesson Plan Development
- Student Testing Instruments
- Administrative Duties
- Instructor and Class Evaluations
- Course and Evolution Management
- Supervision and Management.

Certification

Certification for this course is through the Nova Scotia Professional Qualifications Board and all applications must be submitted to the Nova Scotia Firefighters School a month in advance of the course for the tests to be processed.

Enrollment

Minimum 8 students
Maximum 12 students

Duration

Six Days (3 weekends)

Location

Nova Scotia Firefighters School or other suitable location.
